COVID-19 is a disease caused by a new type of coronavirus (SARS-CoV-2), first identified in December 2019 in the Chinese municipality of Wuhan.

At the end of February 2020, Italy reported a significant increase of COVID-19 cases concentrated in the northern regions of the country. By March 2020, all EU member states had reported quickly increasing COVID-19 cases.

European Commission launched the COVID-19 Clinical Management Support System



On 24 March, the European Commission launched the COVID-19 Clinical Management Support System with the aim to support clinicians in hospitals that are currently facing the coronavirus emergency all over Europe.

Based on the experience with the **European Reference**

Networks, the initiative will help to create rapid connections across Europe among the hospitals indicated by the Member States as reference centres for COVID-19. Clinicians can rely on a dedicated helpdesk managed by <u>DG SANTE</u> to set up web conferences and exchange with their peers in Europe on possible treatments, and on how to handle severe and complex cases.

Second phase of the assessment of ERN ReCONNET new members



The assessment of the applications to join existing ERNs is entering the second phase.

The Board of the ERNs are now assessing all the eligible applications for their Network. The applications with favourable ERN decisions will be then forwarded to the Independent Assessment Body that will conduct an additional assessment. The final phase is the formal approval of each candidature by the ERN Board of Member States, which will take up to two months.

It should be emphasized that the final number of new members will only be known at the end of the whole assessment process, which is expected to be at the end of 2020 (assuming that the COVID-19 outbreak does not slow down the process).

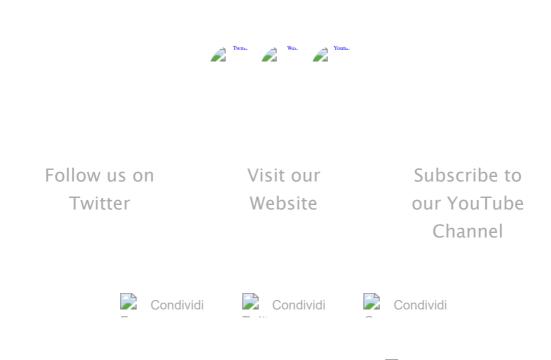
