#### 1. The objectives of the exchange visit were:

Participate in the examination of the nail fold with a capillaroscope;

Learn the difference between normal and abnormal nail fold capillaroscopy findings;

Be able to examine a patient with a capillaroscope and distinguish the nature of scleroderma from non-scleroderma

The goal was to strengthen basic knowledge and skills in order to be able to independently perform capillaroscopy and practice it in Latvia and start to teach capillaroscoy residents in rheumstology

## 2. Please describe the activities performed during your exchange visit:

Familiarity with the capillaroscope examination technique, the differences between different scopes; Capillaroscopy examination of patients with different diagnoses;

Capillaroscopy examination for healthy people;

Differences between non-scleroderma and scleroderma in these examinations;

Learning to draw exam conclusions.

During the exchange visit, several hours of practical lessons were held at the capillaroscopy equipment with regular theoretical explanations by the doctor.

Image analysis of different clinical cases.

Practical work with patients who came for a capillaroscopy visit.

Practical lessons with skin ultrasound examinations.

Practical lessons with LASCA thermographic examinations.

Talks with researchers of the scientific center about current research in rheumatology.

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How to conduct an examination of capillaroscopy independently;

How to differentiate non-scleroderma and sclerodema pattern on these examinations;

I learned how to properly position the capillaroscope, which is very important to get good images.

Read the obtained readings to analyze the pathology from the norm.

Note the boundary conditions that require special attention in the future.

Basic knowledge of ultrasound examination of the skin to be able to measure the thickness of the dermis.

Introducing capillaroscopic examination in daily practice in inpatient and outpatient groups; Start training in capillaroscopy for rheumatology residents.

To introduce colleagues from other specialties

Observing patients with a dynamic model of scleroderma.

A capillaroscope has been purchased in the hospital, it is already in the rheumatology center, and the first tests are being performed on patients
